



Visitor Parking Permit Conditions – Use in Residential Parking Permit Zone

Parking Exemptions

During the six month trial, a vehicle displaying a valid visitor parking permit along with a valid disability parking permit is granted two (2) hours parking in a residential permit zone.

Conditions of Use

The vehicle's registration number along with the date and time the vehicle arrived in the residential permit zone must be written clearly on the permit in ink (pencil is not acceptable).

Visitor parking permits allow parking in residential parking permit zones within the designated areas as defined by Council's Parking Permit Area Map (copy provided with the Visitor Parking booklet).

A maximum of two hours parking is granted for use in the residential permit zone. This time cannot be extended by displaying additional visitor parking permits. Once the two hours has expired, you must remove the vehicle from the length of road.

Visitor parking permit must be displayed face up on the passenger side of the vehicle's dashboard. Disability parking permit must also be displayed correctly (hung from the rear-view mirror).

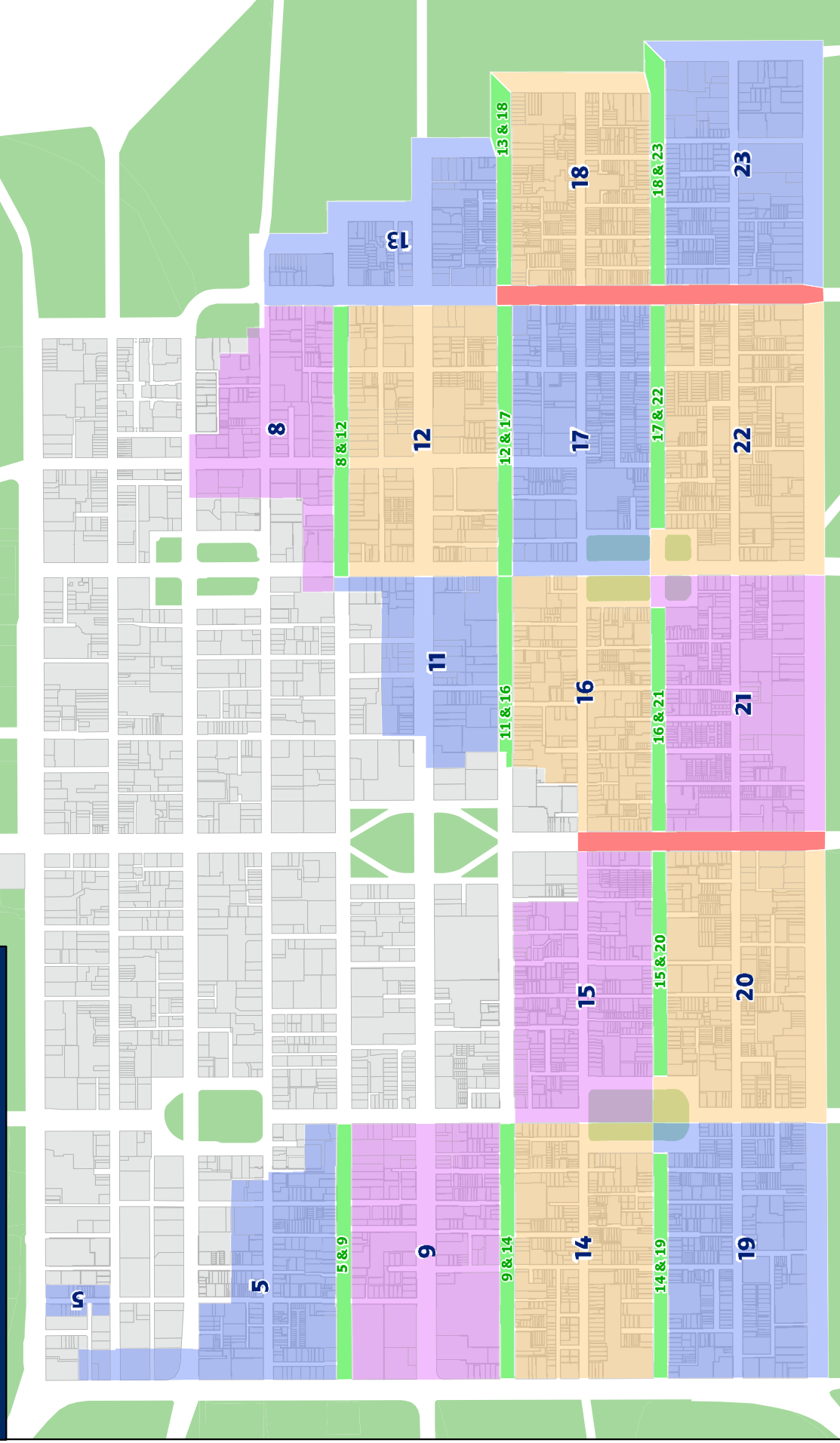
The visitor parking permit is only valid for use in residential permit zones when a disability parking permit is also displayed.

Only one visitor parking permit may be visible on the dashboard at any time.

Visitor parking permits do not ensure a vacant parking space.

By using the enclosed visitor parking permits, the holder accepts and agrees to the permit conditions and acknowledges liability for any Expiation Notices.
