# What is Adelaide Town Hall?

Adelaide Town Hall is a civic hub where important decisions are made by the City of Adelaide. It is open to the public 9am-5pm Monday to Friday and often hosts private or ticketed events outside of business hours.


This guide outlines the accessibility of the **Meeting Hall**, a separate space to the main Town Hall building, located down Paul Kelly Lane, from 25 Pirie St.

There are separate guides for Adelaide Town Hall Civic Events and Events & Functions.

# Getting to the Meeting Hall

## Public Transport:


- The Pirie Street tram stop is approximately 150m from the entrance
- **Bus stop E1** (east side) is approximately 190m from the entrance
- **Bus stop D2** (east side) is approximately 200m from the entrance



# Getting to the Meeting Hall

## Parking:

- There is timed street parking on Pirie Street
- The nearest UPark (secure parking by City of Adelaide) is in Topham Mall, 280m away from the Town Hall entrance
- There are two access parks directly in front of the Town Hall entrance, available from 7pm to midnight Wednesday to Monday



# Street Access & Entrance

## Street Access


The entrance to the meeting hall is located down a laneway off 25 Pirie St. The ground surface is flat pavers and the pathway is mostly under cover.

## Entrance

There are hinged glass double doors at the main entrance, with one step to enter. A permanent accessible entrance is located on the eastern side of the hall.

# Getting Around

## Site Overview

The meeting hall is located down an alleyway between the Town Hall and Colonel Light Centre. The main space is a single-level hall with a raised platform stage.


### Ground Surfaces

The entire hall floor surface is polished floorboard, including the stage area.

### Step-Free Access

There is permanent step-free access into the hall via the eastern door. The stage is the only raised area within the Meeting Hall, with three steps to access.

# Wayfinding

- The hall is one large open space, so it is easy to navigate.
- **Toilets** are located at the south end of the hall next to the stage.
- There is a storeroom on the opposite side of the stage which can be used as a change room, depending on the type of event.
- There is no step free access to the stage.

# Facilities

## Toilets

There are standard gendered toilets and a unisex accessible cubicle at the southern end of the hall, next to the stage.

## Bars

There is no built-in bar at The Meeting Hall, however some functions may have a temporary "pop up" bar.

## Seating

Seating and layout varies depending on the type of function. The seats are nonfixed dining height and may be laid out in rows, around tables, or along the edges of the hall.

## Service Animal Toileting

The nearest service animal toileting area is Victoria Square.
