THE RIVERBANK STROLL

The River Torrens, often simply referred to as the Torrens, flows a remarkable 85 kilometres in a southwesterly direction across the Adelaide Plains.

Within the inner metro to the south lays Adelaide's City Centre with the Festival and Convention Centres on the bank. To its north - Adelaide Oval and Memorial Drive the edge of the district of North Adelaide.

Encased in curved glass cladding, lined with LED lights, the Adelaide Riverbank Footbridge links the Adelaide Oval to the city and allows pedestrians to traverse the Torrens.

ROTUNDA

Elder Rotunda opened in 1882 and was announced as a venue for music performances. With a panoramic view of the River Torrens, it is also a great place to simply relax and enjoy the day.

UNIVERSITY

The Adelaide University at this point backs onto a beautiful part of the riverbank. Explore the grounds of the university and enjoy the architecture if you so choose.

THE ZOO

Home to 250 species of wildlife and offering a number of up-close experiences and exhibits. A day amongst some of the worlds most majestic creatures sits at the cities doorstep.

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MARKETS TO BANK STREET

The recent development of footways connecting these areas has made moving between the cities revered cultural clusters simple. This tour will introduce you to several of Adelaide's metropolitan centres.

You'll pass both the institutions that have thrived for generations and the more recent editions the street press are writing up about.

THE CENTRAL MARKETS

Open Tuesday through Saturday - the perfect spot for city residents to pop in and pick up fresh supplies and for commuters to ponder the multicultural cuisines available and the food courts for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

TOPHAM MALL

In addition to being a convenient pass from Waymouth St to Currie St, Topham Mall also houses some crafty retail, food and drink, including fresh bagels from the Beigelry and city-made brews from Lady Burra.

PEEL & LEIGH ST

Adelaide's highest concentration of trending restaurants and on-point small bars. After five, you'll find patrons sprawling out onto a semi-alfresco style scene. Easily enjoy exploring a few spots in a night.

GRESHAM ST

For something perhaps a little more intimate, a collection of snug little options are popping up along this strip. It's essential to note both Bank and Gresham Streets hit North Tce close to the station.



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ENTERTAINMENT PRECINCT

This kilometre walk from the start of Rundle Mall to Rymill Park covers likely the most essential entertainment locations in the city.

The joy of having much of your shopping, dining and festival performances so linked is something that positively makes this stretch great. Not to mention its simple connection to the local transit services.

RUNDLE MALL

Lined with all the essential department stores, coupled with the most sought after Australian and international brands. Easy access from the King William Street tram stop.

RUNDLE ST

Crossing over Pulteney St, shopping boutiques continue to line the street slowly blending in with many of the most established pubs, dining locations and the primary cinema within the CBD.

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EBENEZER

Running parallel to the eastern end of Rundle St is Ebenezer Place and Vardon Avenue. A semi-secluded leafy strip offering a collection of wine bars and a mix of tasty cuisine.

RYMILL PARK BOTANIC BAR

Perfect for a peaceful stroll or a refreshing sprawl on the grass. With the exception of February and March where the park becomes a key location for the Adelaide festival seasons happenings.



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NORTH TCE.

Marking the northern perimeter of Adelaide's central grid, this stretch is dotted with cultural and social institutions.

At the West end lays the new Royal Adelaide Hospital and the Convention Centre. To the centre the Train Station. Further east sits the most prominent collection of museums and galleries and beyond this you'll find the prized Botanic Gardens and the Adelaide Wine Centre.



The Station is the primary transit stop in the city where both the tram and train services interconnect. Heading east from here you'll find Parliament House and Government House.
