

South East City Dog Trail

Grab your four-legged friend and head to the south east pocket of the city for a pawfect outing that everyone will enjoy. This 3.8 kilometre trail can be followed in either direction, simply park on Hutt Street, pick a direction and start walking!



1. Corner of Hutt Street and Angus Street

Providing a village-like cluster of cafés and restaurants alongside all the day-to-day essentials, Hutt Street is the gateway to the south east of the city.



2. Victoria Park/Pakapakanthi (Park 16)

Adelaide's biggest park land is a haven for all dogs big or small. The wide, open spaces will treat you to expansive views of both the Adelaide Hills and the city skyline while your dog can bound about in the off-leash areas, play a game of fetch, and make some new fur-friends.



3. Carriageway Park/Tuthangga (Park 17)

Home to the South Australian Obedience Dog Club, Carriageway Park/Tuthangga (Park 17) is often the place to be for new fur-parents attending puppy school. A carriage way of historic elm trees traverse the centre of the park providing lots of shade as you follow the path.



4. Pityarilla Dog Park

The fenced dog park in Pelzer Park/ Pityarilla Activity Hub includes natural obstacles and turfed areas providing plenty of fun for your dog. There are two separate sections as well as a water play feature and plenty of shelter and seating.



5. Adelaide Himeji Garden

Step past the ornate gates of the Adelaide Himeji Garden and experience the beauty of Japan with your four legged friend. The two styles of garden within the walls offer plenty of nooks, ideal for settling into a deep meditation. Dogs are welcome in the garden and must be kept on a leash at all times.



6. Corner of Hutt Street and Halifax Street

Take your pick of outdoor seating at one of Hutt Street's cafés and enjoy a well-earned treat for you and your dog!
