Showcase: Public Art Grant Creativity stimulated

Artist James Dodd used the city Free Wall as a temporary outside studio to experiment with mechanical aerosol devices that he constructed to create paintings. At various points, the display and demonstration of the process became performative and interactive. Dodd hopes the project offers an alternative to current definitions and understandings of 'wall painting' in Australia, and that these activities can contribute to broader discussions of creativity in public space.
